

# BABBOE

## Instructions for Rain Tent:

1. Every Babboe comes standard with holders for the rain tent on all four corners (picture 1). Not only does this make the rain tent easy to set up, it is also better for your Babboe because you won't have to drill holes in the wood.

2. The poles are already inserted in the fabric of the rain tent. You only have to insert the poles into the holders. Make sure not to confuse the front and rear side of the tent. The rear side is the side that is close to the handlebars. You can recognize this side by the poles, which are slightly bent (pict 2) and by the cover, which has a hole for the stem (pict 3).



3. Attach the rain tent by tying the rubber bands around the corner mountings (pict 4).

## Getting into the Babboe

Getting into the Babboe is very easy. Roll the rain tent up on one side (picture 5) and your children will be able to climb into the Babboe by themselves. The rain tent also leaves enough space to lift your child into the Babboe and put him or her in a child seat, if needed. Children can also climb into the Babboe when the side window is unzipped (picture 7).

## Ventilation

Because the rain tent is separate from the box and is not closed at the bottom so there is always ventilation. If you want more ventilation or your children want to ride with the windows open there are two separate positions for the side windows. It is possible to ride with the window half opened (picture 6) by closing the three snap fasteners and attaching the window to the Velcro strips at the top of the tent or it is also possible to ride with the window completely open (picture 8) by opening the zippers completely, rolling up the window and tying it with the buttons and loops (picture 9)

Attention: do not leave your children alone in the Babboe. Make sure they do not lick or chew the rain tent.
