

Big Rock Exploration AB has received the exploration permit Ingelshyttan No. 9 granted with very high levels of copper.

Big Rock Exploration AB has been granted the exploration permit, which according to SGU has a content of 9.2% copper. Within the area there are several closed mines, the most recent mine was closed in the 1950s. The area is only 2.5 kilometers from the Lovisa mine.

The exploration permit is located in Lindesberg municipality in Bergslagen. The granting area Ingelshyttan no. 9 is an exploration permit of 79.5 hectares. There are a number of slag heaps on the survey permit and from some slag heaps from the old mines there are rock samples with very high levels of sulphides.

The company intends to carry out electrical VLF surveys as soon as possible to investigate the extent from the old mines in order to identify possible drilling targets.
